
#### LACK OF ACCESS TO EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION IMPACTS ALL OF US!

According to the recently released Santa Cruz County Assessment Project, there is a 30% shortfall in childcare capacity in our county. This means that almost 3,000 children under age six are not able to

find an affordable pre-school and this has long-term consequences to our community. Children that attend pre-school need less remedial and special education, have reduced incarceration rates, as well as lower rates of teen pregnancy. Access to early childhood education increases worker productivity and improves businesses' profitability. Our Child Development Division has openings at many of it's six sites across the county and fees are based on a sliding scale.
