











Pajaro Rebuilds: A Year of Resilience and Renewal

Nearly one year ago, the Pajaro community faced a devastating crisis with the failure of the Pajaro River Levee. In the wake of this disaster, hundreds of families were displaced, many losing everything they had. Thanks to your generous support, Community Bridges Family Resource Collective has been at the forefront of providing crucial aid and resources to the residents of Pajaro during this challenging time.

Over the past year, your donations have enabled us to distribute \$1.7 million in economic aid alone, benefiting 2,940 residents, including 466 children. From providing emergency supplies and disaster case management to mental health services and long-term housing and employment navigation, your contributions have helped families rebuild their lives and communities.

Your support also helped us establish our new Pajaro office, a vital hub for crisis supports and resources, and enhanced our multi-lingual emergency preparedness efforts, ensuring community safety and education. Together, these initiatives have lowered the barriers for Pajaro residents to access the assistance they need.

None of this would have been possible without the outpouring of support we received from more than **1,800 donors**, totaling **more than \$750,000**.

But our work doesn't stop there. We're excited to announce that we have been selected as a nonprofit partner in the **County of Monterey's Pajaro Unmet Needs Disaster Assistance Program** – a unique and unprecedented opportunity made possible through the hard work of local government, invaluable community partners, and the State of California.

This program, backed by \$20 million in recovery funds secured by our state legislators, will provide essential assistance to individuals, households, and small businesses affected by the levee breach.

As a trusted nonprofit partner, we will oversee the distribution of \$5.4 million in individual and household recovery assistance alongside our partners Catholic Charities Diocese of Monterey. We were selected as a nonprofit partner in charge of this distribution because of our experience as disaster case managers and proven record of assisting survivors from multiple local natural disasters, including the CZU wildfires, floods, and atmospheric rivers, as well as the California COVID-19 rental assistance program.

Starting in early March, the County will conduct extensive community outreach efforts to inform residents about the application process. In late March, an Application Center will open at Pajaro Park, offering individuals the opportunity to complete applications in person.

In addition, to help explain the program and facilitate applications, community meetings will be held on the following dates, times, and locations:

Energy Assistance Programs to Help You Save Money!

We have important news to share about Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) resources that can help you save energy and money. PG&E offers financial assistance programs and solutions to help you manage your utility expenses. You may qualify for several programs at once and you can begin applying or enrolling now.



Programs that can help with past due bills:
Relief for Energy Assistance through Community Help (REACH):
Get an energy credit up to help with past due bills.

Programs that can help reduce future energy bills: Family Electric Rate Assistance (FERA) Program: Households of 3 or more, can save 18% on their monthly electric bill.

Energy Saving Assistance (ESA) Program: You may qualify for nocost energy efficient home upgrades. Improving the energy-efficiency of your home can help reduce energy bills.

Budget Billing: Limit stress and keep your energy bills manageable: Enroll in Budget Billing to keep your monthly payments predictable throughout the year.

Medical Baseline Program: Customer with qualifying medical conditions, can get an ongoing monthly energy discount or extra notifications in advance of a Public Safety Power Shutoff
