Ray Cancino: A Decade of Visionary Leadership Transforming Community Bridges and Beyond

This year we mark a significant milestone in our organization's journey as we celebrate a decade under Ray Cancino's remarkable tenure as our CEO. Since Ray's arrival in 2014, his visionary leadership has propelled Community Bridges to new heights, allowing us to better serve and support the Santa Cruz County community while expanding services into Monterey County and San Benito County.

When Ray first stepped into the role, Community Bridges was already a cornerstone of support, with ten vital programs spanning across 20 sites, touching the lives of more than 20,000 individuals annually. Yet, despite our profound impact, we recognized a crucial need to enhance our organizational strategy, visibility and cohesion as an agency.

Ray wasted no time in implementing transformative changes. With a strategic focus on rebranding and unifying our identity, Ray spearheaded the launch of new logos, a revamped website, and a cohesive mission, vision, and values framework. This pivotal step positioned Community Bridges as a unified force, amplifying our reach and impact across the community.

Drawing from his expertise in supportive housing development and case management, Ray catalyzed the expansion of our services to meet the evolving needs of our community. Over the past decade, under Ray's stewardship, Community Bridges has strategically worked to invest in creating longstanding sustainability for the work that we do through asset acquisition in lieu of renting. In a strategic effort to meet that need, we acquired three new building sites for our programs. These include our headquarters, which houses three programs in downtown Watsonville, a building for Elderday, and a facilities site for Lift Line. This acquisition stands as a testament to our commitment to sustainable growth and service excellence, facilitated by the reduction in operating costs.

Moreover, Ray's financial acumen has been instrumental in securing vital resources to fuel our mission. Through strategic investments and prudent fiscal management, our agency's assets have soared by an astounding 600%. Grant funding and donations have surged (grant funding has increased by 695%, and donations have increased by more than 300%), enabling us to bolster our programs and services, despite challenges such as dwindling local government grants [City and County grants decreased by 50% during that time, going from 11% of our funding to 4.5% now] and growing community needs.

In tandem with our organizational and communal financial gains, Ray has prioritized the well-being of our dedicated staff. By initiating several wage increases, uplifting a maximum CEO wage based on our lowest paid worker and fostering a culture of support and appreciation, Ray has empowered our team to deliver their best work, day in and day out. Ray's work has always prioritized equity before it was commonplace in today's conversations by focusing on lowest paid workers, approaching negotiations with unions to focus higher percentage increases on the entry level positions and working collaboratively to hold this value and the reality of limited financial constraints.

Under Ray's leadership, our community engagement efforts have flourished. Our social media presence has skyrocketed, and local media and local government recognition has surged, amplifying our message of hope and resilience. With Ray at the helm, Community Bridges has become synonymous with positive change and compassionate service.

Continuing Our Crucial Work in Pajaro

We're excited to announce that we have been selected as a nonprofit partner in the **County of Monterey's Pajaro Unmet Needs Disaster Assistance Program** – a unique and unprecedented opportunity made possible through the hard work of local government, invaluable community partners, and the State of California.

This program, backed by \$20 million in recovery funds secured by our state legislators, will provide essential assistance to individuals, households, and small businesses affected by the March 2023 levee breach.

As a trusted nonprofit partner, our Family Resource Collective will oversee the distribution of \$5.4 million in individual and household recovery assistance alongside our partners Catholic Charities Diocese of Monterey. We were selected as a nonprofit partner in charge of this distribution because of our experience as disaster case managers and proven record of assisting survivors from multiple local natural disasters, including the CZU wildfires, floods, and atmospheric rivers, as well as the California COVID-19 rental assistance program.

On March 27, an Application Center will open at Pajaro Park, offering individuals the opportunity to complete applications in person. It will be open the following days and times through April 27:

- Tuesdays & Wednesdays - 10am to 7pm
- Thursdays & Fridays - 2pm to 7pm
- Saturdays - 10am to 2pm
- Closed Mondays and Sundays

New Opportunity for Meals on Wheels

We are excited to share that we recently submitted a letter of intent to the Live Oak School District to purchase the Elena Baskin Live Oak Senior Center. The \$2.4 million purchase would ensure continued operations of essential older adult services at the 1777 Capitola Road location and other essential Community Bridges programs.



This purchase would be a win-win, resolving a long-standing issue over the future use of the Senior Center and allowing the continuation of senior services provided by Senior Network Services and Community Bridges as part of the Area Agency on Aging's local network of services.

The Senior Center has been home to Meals on Wheels for Santa Cruz County since the 1970s, providing a centralized location for vital services for older adults and allowing Meals on Wheels to provide daily meals for over 800 older adults. The majority of those we serve are homebound and live below the poverty line.

In addition to the proposed purchase agreement, we are offering the Live Oak School District an option to purchase a nearby property primed for affordable housing construction, supporting the school district's long-held goal of developing a teacher housing project.

As we wait for a response from the Live Oak School District, we continue operating on a month-to-month lease at the 1777 Capitola Road site. We will keep you updated as we learn more. Rest assured that home-delivered meals will continue to be served and congregate dining sites will continue to operate.


