Pajaro Flood Assistance Program Opens

This month marks the launch of the County of Monterey's Pajaro Unmet Needs Disaster Assistance Program, an initiative that has come to fruition through the collaborative efforts of local government, community partners, and the State of California. This unique and unprecedented program, supported by \$20 million in recovery funds secured by our state legislators, is set to provide vital assistance to individuals, households, and small businesses impacted by the levee breach in March 2023.

As a trusted nonprofit partner, our Family Resource Collective, in conjunction with Catholic Charities Diocese of Monterey, will oversee the distribution of \$5.4 million in individual and household recovery assistance. Our selection as a nonprofit partner stems from our extensive experience as disaster case managers, coupled with a proven track record of aiding survivors from various local natural disasters, including the CZU wildfires, floods, atmospheric rivers, and the California COVID-19 rental assistance program.

The Application Center officially opened on March 27 at Pajaro Park, giving individuals the opportunity to complete applications in person. Operating on specific days and times until April 27, the center welcomes applicants during the following hours:

- Tuesday & Wednesday: 10am to 7pm
- Thursday & Friday: 2pm to 7pm
- Saturdays: 10am to 2pm
- Closed on Mondays and Sundays

Furthermore, our Pajaro Long-Term Recovery Center at 14 Porter Drive in Pajaro remains open to North Monterey County residents in need of general assistance and storm recovery navigation services. Staff are available on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays from 9am to 4:30pm.

Being chosen to participate in this program signifies an exciting yet challenging opportunity for us to continue our ongoing mission of enhancing the lives of Pajaro residents. We extend our heartfelt gratitude for your unwavering support. Together, we have the power to make a meaningful difference in the lives of Pajaro residents as they embark on the journey of rebuilding and thriving once more.


