Founder, Leader, and Beloved Advocate for the San Lorenzo Valley

It is with profound sadness that we share the passing of Mary Hammer, a cherished founder of Mountain Community Resources and an enduring advocate for the San Lorenzo Valley. Mary passed away on November 6, 2024, leaving behind a legacy of service, environmental stewardship, and community leadership that will inspire generations to come.

Mary's passion for the Valley began in the 1960s, when she and her husband Joe settled in the area. A dedicated educator and community leader, Mary's impact was felt through her work in local schools, environmental advocacy with the Save the River Foundation, and disaster response efforts following the devastating storms of the 1980s. Her visionary leadership laid the groundwork for modern emergency preparedness initiatives, including the formation of Community Emergency Response Teams.

As the first Executive Director of what is now Mountain Community Resources, Mary guided the organization through transformative years, securing resources for disaster relief and essential services. Today, Mountain Community Resources provides essential services such as food, clothing, counseling, legal assistance, and parenting classes to residents in need. In recent years, we also added showers and laundry facilities, which proved invaluable to firefighters and survivors during the 2020 CZU Fire, along with the hundreds of marginally housed community members which seek basic needs of showers and laundry daily.

In her honor, Mountain Community Resources annually presents the Mary Hammer Green Heart Award to recognize exceptional volunteer service. Today, we carry forward her mission, providing vital resources and support to residents of the San Lorenzo Valley.

Mary's influence extended far beyond her roles. She served as a founding leader of the Valley Women's Club, an Honorary Trustee of the Community Foundation Santa Cruz County, and a champion for sustainable development. Her contributions helped establish the endowed Fund for the Future of the San Lorenzo Valley, ensuring continued support for local nonprofits.

"Mary was a force of nature, and I have never met anyone with such devoted and unanimous support for the things she cared about," said Community Bridges CEO Raymon Cancino. "Throughout the years, I was so grateful to earn her trust, respect, and support for the work we do at Mountain Community Resources. Mary lived her commitment through everyday action, and instilled a lasting testament to ensuring reciprocity and mutual aid was part of what we do. This will be a lasting legacy that will continue to ripple for generations to come and will hopefully ensure we continue to keep the San Lorenzo Valley safe, prepared, and ready to respond to our communities' needs."

Mary is survived by her children, Eric and Lisa, and her grandchildren, Ruby, Charlie, and Nicole. She now joins her beloved husband, Joe, leaving behind an indelible legacy of resilience and unity.


