Free Immigration Consultations & Workshops for Pajaro Residents

La Manzana Community Resources is expanding free immigration services for Pajaro residents, thanks to new funding from the Community Foundation for Monterey County made available through California Assembly Bill 102. As immigration policies continue to shift, many families face uncertainty about their legal status and future. To provide trusted guidance and support, we are offering:

Free Immigration Consultations

In partnership with local immigration attorney Lizett Rodríguez, we are providing free, one-on-one legal consultations to help residents understand their rights and explore their options. Whether you have questions about legal residency, asylum, visas, or deportation defense, this service can help you take the next step with confidence. Appointments are limited—call (831) 724-2997 ext. 213 to schedule.

Pathways to Immigration Workshops

We are also hosting **free**, **Spanish-language information sessions** with immigration attorney **Matthew Weisner** at Pajaro Middle School. These sessions cover key topics such as family-based petitions, adjustment of status, asylum, and naturalization.

children and teens to process their experiences, build resilience, and move forward with a stronger sense of self.
